The City of Carnation is located northeast of the confluence of the Snoqualmie and Tolt Rivers. The incorporated area includes approximately 1.2 square miles, or approximately 736 acres. The potential annexation area adds another 172 acres to Carnation's size.

Residents, employees and shoppers travel through Carnation to and from Duvall, Monroe, Fall City, Snoqualmie, North Bend, Redmond and Woodinville among others. The close proximity to Issaquah and Bellevue adds to the convenience and accessibility of Carnation.

Carnation is a very walkable city with its newly improved Central Business District including wide sidewalks and new Tolt Avenue.

Outdoor enthusiasts and tourists flock to Carnation to visit the Snoqualmie Valley Trail, Tolt MacDonald Park, Agri-tourism sites including Remlinger Farms, u-pick and u-cut farms. Hiking, biking, fishing, paddle boarding, camping and nature walks are popular among locals and outof-towners.


Carnation is home to several live music venues and award-winning music festivals including Timber! and the BrodieNation Music Festival.




